## General Sustainable Business Principles...


- 1 APPROACH AS BUSINESS.**
  - Develop a business plan with organized structure.
  - Understand local markets.
  - Be financially prepared & accountable.
- 2 DEVELOP A STRONG TEAM.**
  - Recognize importance of blended team (not only indigenous & US team members, but also age, experience & background).
  - Have stateside team in place for expertise & financial support.
- 3 UNDERSTAND YOUR IMPACT.**
  - How is your business impacting local economy?
  - What opportunities are you providing your employees?
  - What is your goal for giving?

- 1 DIVERSITY IS STRENGTH.**
  - Recognize that cultures approach business differently.
  - Be willing to grow through compromise.
- 2 KNOW YOUR EXPERTS.**
